METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 1,001 British adults via telephone between 11th and 13th December 2015. Data were weighted by age, gender, region and socio-economic grade to be representative of all GB adults. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
